## Low-maintenance homes offered in DuPage County

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Being able to create a home that perfectly suits your lifestyle is one of the main advantages new construction has over resale. That's exactly why Renzo and Franca Fontana decided to build a new Waterleaf from the ground up at The \$496,925 to \$520,650. Enclave at Mill Creek.

The Meritus Homes community, now in Phase II, is an unexpected oasis in the heart of DuPage County. It features 87 low-maintenance homes and abundant green space, including Westwood Creek, three ponds and a scenic sitting spot. The Fontanas' site is adjacent to a pond and backs up to the creek, giving the family a sense of seclusion and relaxation.

The Waterleaf is one of four ranch plans that offer 1,603 to 2,154 square feet of living space; two, three or four bedrooms; and two full baths for base prices that range from \$413,400 to \$457,400. Second-story options add 866 to 1,090 more square feet of Fontana said. For example,

"The Waterleaf has everything we want and need," said Renzo Fontana.

In addition to an open layout, the secondary bedrooms and full bath are separated from the owner's suite in the 2,154-square-foot ranch. This is the ideal setup for Fontanas, whose son Michael also lives in the home. The family is using the third bedroom as a study where Michael can go to watch television or get on his iPad. Additionally, wide hallways make it easy for Michael to maneuver his wheelchair.

"What was most important to us was that Meritus Homes was willing to make semicustom changes to accommodate Michael's wheelchair,"

Meritus built a ramp in the garage, enlarged the doors to Michael's bedroom and bath, and expanded and added a seat to his shower. "Everyone at Meritus Homes was extremely helpful and responsive. The entire homebuying and building process went remarkably smoothly."

The Waterleaf's open-concept layout also is perfect for entertaining.

"We had our first big family gathering recently and the open floor plan made everyone feel comfortable," said Franca. She added that the high ceilings in the family room make the space live larger and expansive windows along with white cabinets make the kitchen feel light and bright. The basement is huge, too, and offers plenty of storage and play space for the couple's grandchildren.

"We were at a stage in life where a ranch was appealing," Renzo said. "It was becoming more difficult to get Michael and his wheelchair up and down the stairs so single-level living was at the top of our new-home wish list."

The couple also wanted to be closer to their grandchildren in Elmhurst. After living in their two-story Fox River Grove home for more than 30 years, they were ready to leave behind the yard work, pool and deck upkeep in favor of a more carefree lifestyle.

"We had planned on moving once we were both retired, but the pandemic caused Franca to be laid off from her job," Renzo said. "After casually looking for a house for I-290 and Route 83/Kingery

push to do it now."
